

Fifty people see flying saucers

'In masses,' this time

NEW YORK, Sun.:
Fifty people of Farmington, New Mexico, have reported a mass flight of "flying saucers."

Some say they saw hundreds of the mysterious objects above the little oil town.

Details vary, but editor Orville Ricketts, of the "Farmington Daily Times," collected the names of 50 men and women who saw the strange aerobatics by the "saucers."

Clayton Boddy, advertising manager of the paper, said that he was with a group of five business men who saw the mass flight of the "saucers," which disappeared, fluttering through

disappeared, fluttering through the air, without coming to earth.

He said one "saucer" was flying so low it streaked across the sky south to north, clearing the horizon in about three seconds. All the objects were silver coloured except one, which was red.

Ricketts said that witnesses included Air Force pilots, some of them war veterans.

Experts' doubt

Reports of similar flying objects came in yesterday from Havana (Cuba), Mexico City, and Turkey (U.S.A.).

But a spokesman for the American Air Force said experts still believed there was no such thing. Intelligence and technical officers were not impressed by the latest reports.

The spokesman rejected the suggestion that the Air Force was denying the existence of the flying "saucers" to cover up some of its own experiments in space ships and similar air machines.

The Air Force considered that the reports were a "misinterpretation of conventional objects, a mild form of mass hysteria or hoaxes," he said. — (U.P. and A.A.P.)
