

PILOTS ALLEGÈ SEEING FLYING SAUCER

MEMPHIS (Tennessee), Wednesday

A flying saucer, with a window at the bottom and a blinking light on the top flew over Arkansas on Monday night at tremendous speed, two airline pilots claim.

The United States Air Force which previously announced it would have nothing more to do with flying saucers, has sent intelligence officers to interview Captain Jack Adams and First Officer G. Anderson, who have also been invited to appear on Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt's television programme next Sunday.

Adams said to-day: "We firmly believe the flying saucer we saw was a secret, experimental type of aircraft - not a visitor from outer space. We are certain it was not a meteor. It was an aircraft in controlled flight. We were at 2000 feet when we noticed an intense blinking light

about half a mile away. It was a circular object zooming along at 500 to 600 m.p.h. in a wide arc. It remained in view about 30 seconds. There were no navigation lights, but lights from eight or ten windows could plainly be seen on the lower side as it passed ahead of us. A strong blue-white light was flashing very rapidly on top. The object ap-

rapidly on top. The object appeared to be about the size of a DC3 Dakota. There wasn't any exhaust or vapour trail."

Anderson said: "I had read about flying saucers. We were sceptical, as are most people. But what can you do but believe your eyes?"
