

# IMPRESSED BY REPORTS OF 'FLYING SAUCERS'

## Mrs. E. Roosevelt Interviews Pilots

**NEW YORK, Monday.**—Eleanor Roosevelt said yesterday she was impressed by the report of the "flying saucer" from two veteran airline pilots.

She interviewed Captain Jack \_\_\_\_\_

Adams and First Officer G. Anderson on her weekly television programme.

They had caused a stir by declaring they sighted a "strange circular craft with blinking lights" speeding over Arkansas last Monday night.

Mrs. Roosevelt said she had thought people who reported flying saucers were "seeing things" until she heard the pilot's story.

She described it as "evidence we have not heard before—from qualified people"

Captain Ali Baayouni, a pilot of the Egyptian M.I.S.R. Airlines told, in Cairo yesterday, of three silver flying saucers which

three silver flying saucers which he saw on Saturday over the Mediterranean, 35 miles southwest of Haifa.

He added that they were flying in perfect triangular formation at great speed and at a height of about 1200 feet.

"I was flying from Cairo to Beirut when suddenly the second pilot pointed to the west where I saw three metallic discs travelling at staggering speed," he said.

He estimated that they were about the size of fighter aircraft.
