

"FLYING SAUCER" OVER U.S.

CREDENCE GIVEN TO PILOTS' REPORT.

NEW YORK, Mar. 26 (A.A.P.).
—Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt to-day said she was impressed by the report of a "flying saucer" from two veteran airline pilots whom she interviewed—Captain Jack Adams, and first officer G. Anderson, on her weekly television programme.

They had caused a stir by declaring they sighted "a strange circular craft with blinking lights" speeding over Arkansas on the night of March 20.

Mrs. Roosevelt said she had thought the people who reported flying saucers were "seeing things" until she heard the pilots' story. She described it as "evidence that we have not heard before—from qualified people."

Mrs. Roosevelt asked Capt. Adams whether he thought people were aboard the saucer.

"I don't know, but I am positive it was a controlled flight," he replied. A scale model of the weird craft fitting the pilot's description, was televised. It was shaped like a Chinese coolie hat, with one large light at its pointed top and other lights were spaced around the brim.
