

MRS. ROOSEVELT IMPRESSED

NEW YORK, Monday.

Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt said she was impressed by the report of a "flying saucer" from two veteran airline pilots.

She interviewed Captain Jack Adams and First-Officer G. Anderson on her weekly television programme.

They had caused a stir by declaring they sighted "strange circular craft with blinking lights" speeding over Arkansas last Monday night.

Mrs. Roosevelt said she had thought people who reported flying-saucers were "seeing things" until she heard the pilots' story.

She described it as "evidence" we have not heard before—from qualified people."

Mrs. Roosevelt asked Captain Adams whether he thought people were aboard the saucer.

"I don't know but I am positive it was a controlled flight," he replied.

A scale model of the weird craft, fitting the pilots' description, was televised. It was shaped like a Chinese coolie hat with one large light at its pointed top. Other lights were spaced round the brim.
