

## "Flying Saucer" Evidence Impresses Mrs Roosevelt

In New York, Mrs Eleanor Roosevelt, previously sceptical, said that she was "impressed" by a report of a "flying saucer" from two veteran airline pilots. In Cairo, an Egyptian airline pilot said that he saw three "saucers" flying in triangular formation 35 miles south-west of Haifa on Saturday.

**MRS ROOSEVELT** interviewed the Americans, Captain Jack Adams and First Officer G. Anderson, on her weekly television programme.

They had said that they sighted a strange circular craft with blinking lights speeding over Arkansas last Monday night.

In her broadcast, Mrs Roosevelt said that she had thought people who reported "flying saucers" were "seeing things" until she heard the pilots' story.

She described it as "evidence we have not heard before—from qualified people."

She asked Captain Adams whether he thought people were aboard the "saucer."

He replied: "I don't know, but I am positive it was a controlled flight."

A scale model of a weird craft fitting the pilots' descrip-

craft fitting the pilots' description was televised. It was shaped like a Chinese coolie hat with one large light at its pointed top. Other lights were spaced around the brim.
