# Italy has five 'saucer' reports

**Salo (Lake Garda)**—"Disc as large as full moon."

**Carrara**—"Four saucers."

**Cathanzara** — "One saucer heading west like moon with wake of fire."

**Cagliari**—"One saucer—hung over city for 20 seconds."

**Val D'Aosta**—"One saucer."
