

Report of "saucer" at Largs

A "flying saucer" was reported flying fast over Largs North shortly after 1.30 p.m. yesterday. It was seen by Mr. Eddie Lock, of Dover terrace, Largs North, while pitching the roof of a new home.

Mr. Lock said he saw a round, bright yellow object flash quickly across the southern sky in an easterly direction.

It was travelling at an amazing speed, and before disappearing into the stratosphere it seemed to eject a tail from its disc-shaped body.

The Government Astronomer (Mr. G. F. Dodwell) said Mr. Lock's description of the "flying saucer" was similar to that of a daylight meteor.

About 10 years ago, on a bright Sunday afternoon, Adelaide people saw a bright object in the sky which they thought to be a plane on fire.

However, later reports from farmers near Blythe proved it to be a daylight meteor which exploded over Kybunga, 80 miles north of Adelaide. Frag-

miles north of Adelaide. Fragments of this meteor reached the ground, but were never located.
