

# Even Mt. Gambier has its 'saucers'

**MT. GAMBIER, Tuesday:** Two men near Mt. Gambier are convinced that they saw a flying saucer last week.

Both men, Jim Blackmore, of Kongorong, and his son Cyril, are farmers.

They said they "kept quiet about it" at first, because the few people they told asked them what they had been drinking.

But then they thought it over, and concluded that they could not be wrong.

Also, they said, their story could be "backed up" by two neighbours, Peter and Lewis McQuade.

The Blackmores said that, with the two McQuades, they were resting at Koondi cattle station 23 miles from Mt. Gambier.

Jim Blackmore was first to see "the saucer." It was five or six miles up, and flashed south-

east across the sun, faster than any aeroplane any of the men had seen.

It seemed round. It gave out no smoke or flame and there

no smoke or flame, and there was nothing to show what drove it through the air.

The four men saw it, and the information they swapped later was similar.
