

“Flying Saucer” in Action

HOBART, Monday. — About 40 models, including a “flying saucer” and jets, were seen in action at a model Aero Club display at Hobart to-day.

It was staged by the West Hobart Model Aero Club. The “flying saucer” was about a foot in diameter.

Outstanding model was a jet built by David Reynolds. In two flights it reached speeds of 90 and 95 miles an hour, and was the first jet model to be flown in Tasmania. It was copied from an American model which holds the world speed record of 159 m.p.h.

The models were controlled by wires from the ground.
