

Did You See It Too?

A Mt. Hawthorn resident and his wife saw what they thought was a "flying saucer" flash across the sky and disappear over the ocean about 9.15 p.m. yesterday.

Resembling a glowing football, the object, first seen by Mr. D. Roberts, of Buxton-st., moved as fast as a meteor.

Mr. Roberts called his wife, who became frightened by the bright, fast-moving object.

The Guildford meteorological station said that no balloons were released last night, and Government Astronomer H. S. Spigl said that he could not explain it. He had received no reports of any unusual objects in the sky.

Mr. Roberts said that the object was visible for about a minute. When he went to call

minute. When he went to call his neighbour, the object disappeared out to sea. "It was very bright and left a glow behind it as it flashed across the sky like a falling star," Mr. Roberts said.

The only aircraft leaving Guildford last night about the time of the reported sighting of the "flying saucer" was an ANA Skymaster about 9.45 p.m.—30min. later.

● *Two South Perth residents reported on April 18 that they had seen what they thought might be a "flying saucer" moving at high speed over the Como Hotel. They described it as a bright, orange-red ball flying at high speed. A railway driver and fireman when near Pinjarra reported a strange aerial sight, which suggested a meteor to them. There have been many reports of "flying saucers" from the Eastern States.*
