

"FLYING SAUCER" WAS METEOR

SYDNEY, This Afternoon.—
The "flying saucer" which many people "saw" in Southern Queensland and Northern N.S. Wales on Wednesday night has been identified as a meteor.

The Government Astronomer, Mr. Hartley Wood said there was no doubt the object was a meteor. "In fact two description we had of it were best we have ever had of a meteor," he said.

The object had been seen within five minutes at such widely scattered places as Glen Innes, Kempsey, Sydney and Brisbane.

"The meteor would be about 80 miles up and travelling faster than 25 miles a second. That is the reason it was seen over such a wide area," Mr. Wood explained.
