

"Lights soared in the sky"

THOSE "SAUCERS"

HERE NOW!

THREE CLAIMS

THREE people claimed they saw a "flying saucer" swoop over Melbourne suburbs about 8 p.m. on Thursday.

The two men and a woman who claim they saw the "saucer" from Box Hill, Oakleigh, and Sandringham, are certain that it was not an aeroplane, a meteor, or a falling star.

At least 15 people, including two airline pilots, claimed they saw "flying saucers" in New South Wales and Queensland on Wednesday night.

Sandringham footballer Murray Guille, 23, was with a friend in Bay st., Sandringham, when they saw a "saucer" speed though the western sky at 8.15 p.m. on

the western sky at 8.15 p.m. on
Thursday.

"We saw two bodies of light soaring through the sky," he said.

"Behind the bodies of light was a trailing flame. I saw it for six or seven seconds before it disappeared behind thick cloud. I could not see any kind of mechanism between the lights."

'Blue streak'

Mr. Miller of Camden rd., Oakleigh, said he saw a bright blue streak of light flash across the sky horizontally for about 10 seconds.

Mrs. K. Thomson, of Glenferrie rd., Hawthorn, said: "At 8 o'clock I was visiting at Box Hill when I saw a disc-like object flash across the sky towards the east.

"At first, I thought it was a rocket because of the green objects on either side and the long tail but it travelled in a perfectly straight line."

Mr. A. W. Walker, vice-president of the Astronomical Society of Victoria, yesterday advised people who saw strange objects in the sky to look for these main characteristics: **ALTITUDE, DIRECTION, VELOCITY, COLOR, and BEHAVIOR.**
