

12 reports on green "saucer"

**MELBOURNE,
Fri.—Twelve people
today claimed they
saw a flying saucer
over Melbourne sub-
urbs last night.**

They said it was similar to the "saucer" reported in northern New South Wales and southern Queensland on Wednesday.

They were certain the object was not a meteor or a falling star, they said.

The vice-president of the Victorian Astronomical Society (Mr. A. W. Walker) tonight said:

"I have an open mind on flying saucers. They are possible, but we have not sufficient information yet to establish definitely their existence."

Mr. Murray Guille, 23, said he was with a friend in Sandringham about 8 o'clock last night, when both saw a "saucer" dash across the western sky.

"We saw two bodies of light followed by a trailing flame," he said.

"We watched the object for about seven seconds before it disappeared behind thick cloud."

"Blue streak"

Mr. H. Miller, of Camden Road, Oakleigh, said he watched a bright blue streak of light flash across the sky for about 10 seconds.

Mrs. K. Thompson, of Glenferrie Road, Hawthorn, said: "I was standing outside my son's home at Box Hill when I saw a disc-like object flash across the sky."

“At first I thought it was a rocket. It had green objects on either side and a long flaming tail.

“Then I realised that rockets do not look like discs and that rockets could not travel in a straight line.”

Fifteen people in northern N.S.W. and southern Queensland reported on Wednesday that they had seen an object which they claimed was a flying saucer.

The New South Wales Government Astronomer (Mr. Harley Wood) said last night that the object was a meteor.
