Some are flying discs, other long tubes lit with the eeriest lights human beings have ever seen; others are like rubber heels, and some just lights which behave in the strangest fashion.



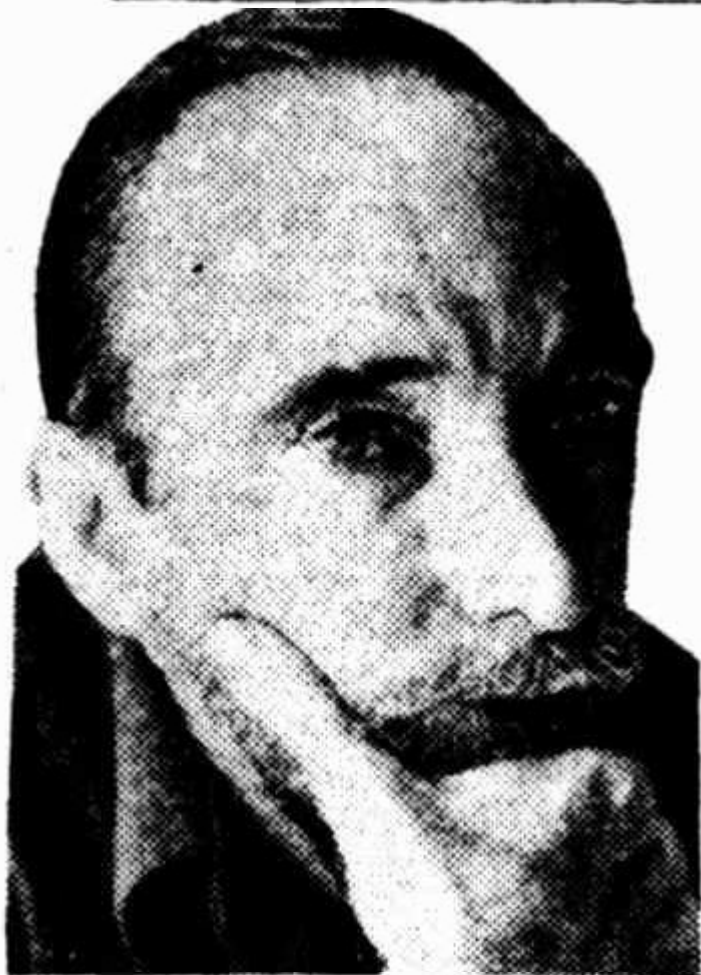
ALL told: about 400 of these objects have been sighted and thousands of people have seen them. Some of the watchers were trained, official observers equipped with instruments.

THE first reports of the "Flying Saucers" were pooh-poohed as figments of the imagination.

But, as sightings snowballed from hundreds of reliable, respected citizens, air pilots, naval and military observers, mostly in the United States, officialdom had to agree that there was something in the reports.

Gerald Heard examined all these reports and official documents as well.

The flying objects ranged from small things only a

from small things only a couple of feet across to great sky ships 500 and 1.000 feet in diameter.

One sighting was made at the rocket proving grounds at White Sands, New Mexico, by naval observation teams, including the officer in charge, Commander McLaughlin.

The observation teams were watching a rocket in flight and had instruments trained on it, when two small sky apparitions appeared following the rocket. They crossed the rocket's trail, and flew alongside it, finally shooting ahead of it into space at fantastic speed.

Near Fort Knox, Kentucky, on January 7, 1948, air force planes were standing by for a showdown with a big space ship which had been reported. When it was sighted they chased it.

Captain Mantell, pursued it above the clouds and reported his progress by radio telephone to the ground.

Suddenly his messages ceased. His plane crashed and was found in many pieces. Did he get too close?

Captain Mantell's death was the only one reported from contact with the "flying saucers." Every report showed that they tried and succeeded easily in eluding pursuit. They could outpace the most modern planes with extraordinary ease.

Gerald Heard and other investigators came to the conclusion that there was no need to be panicky. The sky visitors behaved with wonderful consideration.

When airline captains met them on air traffic lanes, the sky apparitions swerved aside. Some of the visitors seen at night were like long flying tubes lit with the most eerie lights airmen had ever seen. Pilots, passengers, and ground staff alike saw them.

The Government officially denied that it was responsible for the sky visitors.

An American official investigation was held known as Project Saucer. The F.B.I. was asked to assist.

It stated: "The 'flying
saucers' are not a joke: nor
are they a cause for
alarm." It was a frank fac-
ing up to the mystery.
