The Gas Man Sees A 'Flying Saucer'

Mr. Fred Sault, 59, of Zoeller Street, Concord, thinks he saw a "flying saucer" last night.

Mr. Sault, who works for the Australian Gas Light Co., was reading meters at the Mortlake works at 6.55 p.m. when he saw "a brilliant disc-like object" flash across the sky and disappear in a northerly direction.

It was bright blue and had no tail, said Mr. Sault, who added: "I have seen plenty of falling stars and meteors, but this was something I had never seen before.

"Although the object was at a terrific height it appeared to be as big as a football.

"I watched it for three or four seconds before it disappeared.

"It looked like a flyin^g saucer because it had a disc-like shape."

Neither the Civil Aviation control authorities at Mascot nor the Sydney weather bureau, nor the Riverview College Observatory had any inquiries about "flying saucers" or meteors last night.
