

"Saucer" Again in the News

**MILDURA, Sunday—Some-
thing which looked like a "fly-
ing saucer" was seen high in
the sky to-day from a point
on the Murray River between
Nangiloc and Colignan, up-
stream from Mildura.**

Witnesses were two Redcliffs
men, Dr. T. L. Barker and Mr. J.
H. Cumper, who were on a fishing
trip.

Dr. Barker said to-night that he
was lying on his back about 2.15
p.m. when he saw in the sky a
small whitish object travelling
swiftly north.

Dr. Barker said the object was
of a whitish color, being "some-
thing like the moon rather than
silvery."

Burnie "Visitant"

A Cooee resident, Mr. Basil Russell, and his 10-year-old son saw on Saturday evening what Mr. Russell described as "a dazzling object moving eastward at a terrific speed over Burnie." Both are positive the object was not an aeroplane.

They were cycling to Cooee from Somerset when the boy noticed the object very high in the sky and drew the attention of his father.

Mr. Russell said: "We could not tell what shape it was, but it was zig-zagging and diving about. At one stage it hovered for a short while, then floated off again."

Mr. Russell said it was not quite sunset when the object was noticed, and it was far too bright to be a star so early in the evening. It was visible for about a minute and a half, when it disappeared to the east.
