

"Flying Saucer" Seen Along Murray ?

MELBOURNE, Sun.: Two Red Cliffs men, Dr T. L. Barker and Mr J. H. Cumper, have reported what looked like a "flying saucer" from a point on the Murray River between Nagiloc and Colignan, upstream from Mildura.

The saucer appeared about 2.1 p.m. and both men watched it for about a minute. They described it as a small whitish object travelling swiftly north.

Mr L. R. Hokin, of Jacques ave Bondi, who claimed last night he saw a "flying saucer" is still convinced he was right.

Mr W. Gell, meteorologist at Mascot Airport, said he saw the object and was sure it was a meteorite. It was visible for about two seconds. Mr Hokin, a soil laboratory technician, said about 12.30 a.m. today he saw an egg-shaped object streaking south east across the sky. It was a bright whitish light surmounted by a green light. He added that he had seen plenty of meteors when he worked as a pathologist in Kurume Hospital in Japan and he was sure this was not a meteor or a falling star.
