

"Saucer" was a kite

Dayton newspapermen had little trouble in tracing down this flying saucer story:—

When calls reporting a saucer flooded Dayton newspaper offices reporters went to the Dayton area where most of the calls originated.

They found Bill Allison, a General Motors plant assembler, flying a kite.

But it was a special kind of kite, Mr. Allison explained. A "polymorphic" one, he called it, made of white tissue paper. He had used 7500 feet of crochet cotton to send the six-sided kite up 6000 feet into the air.—('Christian Science Monitor.')
