

THE EARTH IS NOT A FLYING SAUCER

WHILE it is generally known that the earth is not flat and suspended between heaven and hell rather like a flying saucer, there is still much about its origin that is a mystery.

Complex academic terms have been carefully avoided in the telling of this and other stories, which are assembled in a form which is crystal clear to the reader.

The progress of the human race, from the first stages of evolution to the present day, is also told in clear prose, reinforced by specially designed illustrations.

These include pictures of weird-looking animal and plant life which were to be seen in Australia in the Jurassic period 150,000,000 years ago.

No less weird-looking are the pictures of Neanderthal man—so named because the first fossils of this human type were found at Neanderthal in Germany in 1859.

How modern man has emerged from this species is told in detail.
