

# Church People Say They Saw Flying Saucers

A party of picnickers saw what they believed to be a flying saucer at Glenroy last week.

The picnickers—members of St. Paul's Church of England Young People's Fellowship—noticed the object when it appeared from behind a range of hills.

As it flashed across the sky the object, which appeared to be round and silver, left in its wake a dense stream of vapor or smoke. When it first came into view from the north-east it was climbing steeply and after several seconds traced an arc across the sky and disappeared in the south-west.

The object was visible for more than three minutes and, when first seen, was emitting a continuous stream of vapor or smoke. However as it was disappearing from sight the substance left behind came in short bursts like, say our informants, the exhaust from a car

mants, the exhaust from a car engine: What distinctly resembled a white rainbow remained in the sky for nearly a quarter of an hour before evaporating. No sound could be heard.

Several people in Lithgow also observed the strange object—"Mercury."
