

HIS TELESCOPE PICKED UP SAUCER

NEW YORK, September 21
(Special).—Despite the Navy's statement that flying saucers are merely weather balloons, there is scientific suggestion that the objects really exist.

Gordon Vaeth, himself a United States Navy aeronautical engineer, claims this in a book "Two Hundred Miles Up."

He describes how he was watching a number of weather balloons with a theodolite in a 25 inch telescope when a strange object came into view.

It was "an ellipsoid about two and a half times as long as wide, gleaming white.

"It left no vapour trail, made no noise, and disappeared in 60 seconds."

Vaeth then checked the winds at various heights and got "positive proof" the object could not have been a balloon.

It represents one of the best substantiated unidentified object sightings on record.
