

Flying Saucers Again —Over Korea

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19 (A.A.P.). — Flying saucers have reappeared: This time over Korea flying alongside U.S. bombers

The U.S. Air Force disclosed to-day that it has ordered a full investigation of reports by two bomber crews that they had watched the "saucers."

An Air Force spokesman said the objects were described by four eye-witnesses as globe-shaped, bright orange in colour, and emitting an occasional flash of bluish light.

Several were sighted, but the spokesman did not say how many.

The first of the reports were given to intelligence officers by two members of the crew of a Superfortress. The airman said that they saw the objects flying parallel to their plane at about midnight on January 29, near Wonsan, in

Communist territory, with a similar report. Two airmen said that they saw the objects parallel to the bomber at about midnight.

"The objects remained with the B-29 over Wonsan for five minutes and with the B-29 over Suncheon for one minute," the spokesman said.

[In June 1947, a private pilot named Kenneth Arnold, told reporters that he saw nine shimmering discs flying at high speed near Mount Ranier, Washington.

Soon similar stories of "flying saucers" were pouring in from all parts of the world.

The U.S. Air Force set up a special investigating body to look into the reports and two years later after investigating nearly 400 separate "sightings," it reported that it was satisfied that **there was nothing to the scare.]**
