

Flying Saucer Seen in Sydney

MUCH LARGER THAN SKYMASTER

Sydney, May 4.—At least nine men reported seeing a "flying saucer" over the Sydney area and at Parkes, 180 miles west of Sydney, about 6 a.m. yesterday.

They said that it was a cigar-shaped object, well lit, which flew silently and very fast.

The R.A.A.F. and civil aviation officials and meteorologists at the Sydney Weather Bureau could not give an explanation.

"It was a long thing like an airship or a submarine and all lit up like a liner at sea," one man said.

It was at least three or four times larger than a four-engined Skymaster. It made no sound as it flew and travelled at about 500 m.p.h.

During the past month "flying saucers" have been reported from Arizona, Minnesota and Singapore. In each case scores of eye-witnesses said that the objects were "cigar-shaped."
