

"FLYING SAUCER" SEEN IN TWO STATES

SYDNEY, May 4.
A "flying saucer" has been seen in north-eastern Victoria and also in several parts of NSW.

More than a dozen persons reported seeing the 500 n.p.h. cigar-shaped, well lit object flashing through the sky at a height of up to 20,000 ft. early yesterday.

An interstate transport driver and his wife reported seeing it when they were near Benalla (Victoria) at 1.30 a.m. yesterday.

The NSW reports covered a wide area, from Bargo in the south to as far west as Parkes.

All state the "flying saucer" was seen about 6 a.m. yesterday.

Men and women who reported the strange object are adamant that it was a "flying saucer."

The reports of the "flying saucers" are the first in Australia for some time. Earlier reports had been made in Sydney, Adelaide, Canberra and Queensland in the past two years.

MELBOURNE, May 4. — Three people reported a "flying saucer" over north-eastern Victoria early yesterday.

A railway signalman at Wangaratta said he saw one as he was coming to work.

"It was too big to be an ordinary rocket and too slow for a meteor," he said. He said the object could have been a daylight meteor, some

been a daylight meteor, some of which did not shed a "tail."

Commenting on the report, Mr A. J. Vial, the navigator of a Robby's Aircraft plane which made three photographing runs over the city at high levels yesterday, said:—

"Reflections of sunlight from the perspex windows of an aircraft can cause some odd impressions on people who are not used to them."
