

Saucer Over Melbourne Reported

Gen. Vandenberg said
neither man nor radar had
seen a flying saucer in the
US.

MELBOURNE, August 1.

A flying saucer was reported over Melbourne late tonight.

People in the suburbs of Camberwell and Hawthorn reported seeing it flashing across the sky.

Mr. W. G. Pratt, of Camberwell, said he was walking with several other people when they saw "a mystery object in the sky."

Mr. Pratt said it was a long, pencil-like, dark-colored object, with lights at the side.

"It was travelling at terrific speed," he said, "and made a whirring noise. It suddenly disappeared behind a cloud."

Weather Bureau officials said that it was probably a meteor.

Some simple explanation would be found for Washington radar indications during the latest flying saucer scare, Dr. D. F. Martyn said today.
