

# 'SAUCER' VICTIM HIRES AGENT

*NEW YORK, Sun.: Mr. J. D. Desvergers, a Scoutmaster, who said he was shot at by a flying saucer, today had a publicity agent to "protect" him from inquisitive reporters and the Air Force.*

Mr. Desvergers said he had made a gentlemen's agreement with the agent, Mr. Art Weil, that any further details on his experience would be

reserved for certain magazines.

Presumably, the announcement meant Mr. Desvergers would not permit further questioning by the Air Force.

The Air Force in Washington said it had only an unofficial report on Mr. Desvergers' experience and did not have enough information to draw a conclusion. But it said it thought the incident explainable.

## **"No legal hold"**

"The Air Force has no legal hold on Mr. Desvergers," Mr. Weil said:

Mr. Desvergers, 30, said  
the hair on his arm was  
singed off and three holes  
about one-eighth of an  
inch in diameter were  
burnt in his Scout cap last  
week while on an outing in  
the Florida everglades with  
three Boy Scouts.

He said he found a  
mushroom-shaped object  
large enough for six or  
eight men to stand up in.

"I heard the hinges open,  
and they shot a flare at  
me," he said. "I believe  
I was under and near it  
for about three minutes.—
