

## ***Glowing monster "on the nose"***

**NEW YORK, Sun.**—Seven people investigating a flying saucer report near Sutton, West Virginia, said yesterday they had seen a 10-foot, glowing "Frankenstein monster."

They said the monster gave off "a sickening metallic smell."

Mrs. Kathleen May, of Flatwood, West Virginia, said she and six boys, including a 17-years-old member of the National Guard, climbed a hill near Sutton after her two small sons said they had seen a bright object land on the hill.

State police laughed off the reports of the "monster" as hysteria.

They said the so-called monster had "grown from seven to 17 feet in 24 hours."

Gene Lemon, a member of the National Guard, who led the party up the hill, said he saw what seemed

Lee Stewart, co-publisher of the Braxton County Democrat, said he and several men with shotguns returned with Lemon about half an hour later.

**But they saw no monster, they said.**

Mrs. May and Lemon described "the thing" as having the shape of a man, a blood-red face, a bright green body, protruding eyes, hands held forward and appearing to give off an eerie light.

They said it had a black shield in the shape of the ace of spades behind it and wore what looked like a pleated metallic skirt.

"It looked worse than Frankenstein's monster," Mrs. May said.—
