

# NOW RAF SEES 'EM

London, Sat: A "flying saucer" entered Mainbrace manoeuvres today.

RAF station at Topcliffe, Yorkshire, reported to exercise hqrs. that a silver object, circular in shape, appeared 5 miles behind a Meteor fighter flying at 15,000 feet.

Object maintained a slow forward speed before descending with a swinging pendulum motion

When the meteor turned back towards base the object appeared to follow suit.

Object then began a rotary motion about its own axis and suddenly accelerated at incredible speed in a westerly direction, but later turned to a south-easterly course.

RAF officers and men who saw it said its movements weren't identifiable with anything they'd seen in the air. Acceleration was greater than that of a

was greater than that of a shooting star.

Incident lasted between 15 and 20 seconds.

**An RAF spokesman** wouldn't say whether the report was being regarded seriously or not. He added "Reports are being investigated."

Some observers of the incident believe the object might have been a parachute or cowl from a meteor aircraft, but none is reported to have landed in the vicinity.

A signal reporting the object was sent from Topcliffe airbase, Yorkshire.

It was seen by at least 10 officers and crew members
