

FLYING SAUCER DISC FOUND ON QUARRY

New York, Tuesday—Authorities at West Orange, New Jersey, are investigating a flying saucer type of disc. It was discovered yesterday on top of a rocky cliff belonging to a quarry company, said a report in the "New York Times" today.

The report said the silver object, with a conical surface and 6ft in diameter, was found by an employee of the company that operates at the quarry.

The disc was constructed of a heavy cardboard material and contained circular wiring and a number of broken bulbs. It was without any source of electrical or propelling power.

The authorities in West Orange discounted theories that the disc was a hoax, because of the inaccessibility of the cliff on which it was found, said the "Times" report. They said its location indicated that it could

have been dropped from an aircraft.

A stamp inside the disc said the cardboard was manufactured in New York.
