

"Flying Saucer" Found on Cliff

New Yor, Dec. 18. — Authorities of West Orange, New Jersey, were investigating a "flying saucer" type of disc that was discovered yesterday on top of a rocky cliff belonging to a quarry company, said a report in the "New York Times" to-day.

The report said that the silver object which had a conical surface and was 6 ft. in diameter, was found by an employee of the company that operates the quarry.

The disc was constructed of a heavy cardboard material and contained circular wiring and a number of broken bulbs. It was without source of electrical or propelling power. A large "11" was painted in black on its surface.

Authorities in West Orange discount theories that the disc was a hoax because of the inaccessibility of the cliff on which it was found, said the report.

Its location indicated that it could have been dropped from an aircraft.
