

"FLYING SAUCER" AT WARWICK?

WARWICK, Jan. 9.—Although not prepared to classify it as a "flying saucer," several Warwick residents are mystified by an unusual phenomenon in the south-western sky early last night.

They first noticed a particularly bright light about 10 degrees above the horizon and their interest grew as it appeared to travel for several degrees westward and then gradually fade, only to reappear shortly afterwards in the original position.

The light was bright enough to cast a faint reflection on a filmy cloud nearby. They next trained field glasses on it and, after comparing observations, decided that it was globular shaped, with a long tapering tail, and with fan-like protuberances on each side at the junction of the tail and globe. Shortly after 9 p.m. the object disappeared.
