

RIDDLE OF FLYING SAUCERS MAY SOON BE SOLVED

SANTA FE

(NEW MEXICO), Friday.

The newspaper Santa Fe-New Mexican said yesterday it had learned of fantastic strides in guided missiles and rockets which might explain, in part, reported sightings of strange objects in the skies.

Managing editor Richard Everett, in an article said that although details were still shrouded in official secrecy, the wraps might be removed from some aspects of the guided missiles programme as a special demonstration.

Based on information from official and unofficial sources the New Mexican said "the most logical conclusion" was that the country's guided missiles experts had succeeded "in developing unmanned craft capable of manoeuvrability range and speeds heretofore undreamed of except in comic strips."

The article said highly placed persons declined to discuss the experiments under way there except "in the broadest and most general terms" but added the adjectives "fantastic and tremendous" were featured in their off-the-record remarks.
