

Flying saucers --Japan now!

TOKIO.—Latest flying saucer news has come from U.S. airmen operating over Northern Japan.

Many U.S. Air Force flyers claim to have seen "mysterious rotating clusters of red, white and green lights", during reconnaissance flights.

The saucers were seen close to Soviet territory in the Kurile Islands and Sakhalin, where the Reds have dozens of air bases.

Colonel Curtis Low, commander of the northern division of the Japan Air Defence Force, said the clusters were seen by fighter pilots, and had been tracked on radar. There were several authentic intelligence reports on the mysterious objects.

According to flyers who had seen them, the objects were much the same as saucers seen in various parts of the world during the last three years.

A fighter ace, Colonel David Blakeslee, took observations on one rotating cluster on December 29, and tried in vain to intercept it in his jet plane. The object was much too speedy for him, however, and disappeared in five seconds.

Five men who had seen the objects from the ground said they were "circular ferris-wheel disc types, with rotational red,

green and white lights. They were visible at various times, for from 30 minutes to three hours.

The reports were too widespread and similar to be discarded, said an Air Force spokesman.
