Russian Experiment

RASH OF "FLYING SAUCER" CHASES

New York, Jan. 23. — Russian experiments had resulted in a rash of new 'flying saucer' chases over Japan the "New York Daily News" said to-day. The experiments were being made with supersonic guided missiles in Korea and Manchuria the "Daily News" said.

The newspaper claimed that the information was obtained in Washington where it was believed that the guided missiles were anti-aircraft weapons.

Rockets propelling such missiles, the report added, roared back an exhaust flame that changed colour according to altitude, weather conditions and the length of flight, thus explaining the coloured lights reported.

An ordnance officer working with the United States air force said such missiles could reach a speed in excess of 1000 m.p.h. The reported course of the objects, some of

course of the objects some of which headed back for Manchuria and Siberia at an altitude of 35,000 ft. led intelligence experts to believe they were radar-guided.
