

FLYING SAUCERS AT BATLOW

CHECK TO BE MADE BY INVESTIGATION COMMITTEE

Australia's Flying Saucer Investigation Committee will examine reports of unidentified objects seen near Batlow.

The Batlow report said that seven times between May 18 and July 5 balloon-like, luminous spinning objects had been seen high in the sky.

Each time four objects had been seen between 7 p.m. and 11.15 p.m. on clear nights and sometimes twice a week.

They were glowing red and spinning as they moved backwards and forwards at a high speed across the sky.

Mr. Wal Hawkins, of Kunama, informed the "Tumut Times" that several weeks ago he and his wife saw a luminous ball to the east of their residence. It was cold and overcast at the time, with light rain falling and the object was first seen at about 9.30 p.m. It appeared to be just above the treetops not far away. It would rise vertically and come down again and remain stationary at varying heights.

The object will glow brilliantly just before it rose each time and emit sparks, whilst it would become duller when stationary.
