

R.A.F. worried on 'saucers'

LONDON, November 10: Intelligence officers of the R.A.F. are now investigating every case of "flying saucers" over Britain.

This serious approach to the saucers follows several cases when trained observers such as R.A.F. men, have seen flying saucers, states the "Daily Express."

Latest case comes from two pilots together in a Vampire jet at 20,000 feet over Kent last week.

They saw an object which at first seemed to be a star or bright stationary light. It was very much higher than they were and after a few seconds it passed over their aircraft at a tremendous speed.

The object was main-

taining a level flight, was circular in shape and appeared to be reflecting or emitting a fierce light.

Two other incidents are worrying R.A.F. intelligence.

On October 9 two commercial pilots saw an object in the sky when on

the way to Paris. On their return they told that the unidentified object had been plotted on a radar screen at 50,000 feet.

The day Neville Duke broke the world's speed record several R.A.F. men saw a saucer hovering over the airfield.

The R.A.F. is now exchanging information on the subject with America. The U.S. Air Force is beginning to suggest hesitantly that flying saucers could be interplanetary.
