

FLYING SAUCER "RECOGNISED"

LONDON.—The British War Office on Wednesday officially recognised the flying saucer.

It reports that an anti-aircraft unit in south-eastern London picked up a signal on its radar screen, and followed the track of the "object," which appeared to be circular or spherical and white in color.

It added that the object was also seen through a telescope by men of the same unit on the same day.

Double In Sao Paulo (Brazil) on Wednesday, Adolfo Vasconcellos was sentenced to 13 years' in prison for the murder of his "double," Jose Dos Santos, in a 50,000 - dollar (about £22,000) life insurance plot. According to the indictment, Vasconcellos killed Dos Santos and planted false identification papers on the body.
