

War Office Officially Recognises Flying Saucer

LONDON: The British War Office yesterday officially recognised the flying saucer.

A War Office report said an anti-aircraft unit in south-east London on November 3 picked up a signal on its radar screen unit and followed the track of the "object," which appeared "circular or spherical and white in colour."

The War Office said the object was also seen through a telescope by men of the same unit the same day.

The Air Ministry said last night that all reports of possible "saucers" were investigated, but in 95 per cent of the cases there was a natural explanation.

They were either meteorites or reflections of sunlight or moonlight on aircraft.

It added: "But in the remaining cases there was no explanation. There is no conclusive evidence for say-

conclusive evidence for saying that flying saucers do or do not exist."
