

Meteor May Have Been "Saucer"

Mr. John Rasch, of Belair, said yesterday that the "flying saucer" reported over Melbourne on Sunday night was probably a meteor which he and three other people saw from Belair at 8.15 p.m. SA time.

People at Essendon, Greensborough, and Richmond, Victoria, reported seeing a 'rocket-like' object with a fiery tail, at that time.

Mr. Rasch said that the meteor, which appeared low down in the S-S-E sky, was bright with a trail of red sparks. It turned white, then blue. It covered an arc of between 10 and 15 degrees low on the horizon.
