

# **PICTURES MUST BE GENUINE**

**The offer by The Mail to pay £100 for the first authentic photograph taken by a reader of a flying saucer over South Australia is still open.**

But before the prize is paid the photographer must present proof that his picture is genuine.

To qualify for the award he must be prepared to substantiate his claim by producing:

- An affidavit that to the best of his belief the object photographed had no known earthly identity.

- A complete description of the occurrence, giving time, place, direction, size, speed, weather, and all other relevant details.

- Corroborative evidence wherever possible from at least one other witness

Since The Mail's £100 offer was announced several alleged flying saucer pictures have been received.

One showed a drawing of a space ship rephoto-

graphed on to a picture of the Adelaide Town Hall skyline.

Another picture proved on enlargement to be a kitchen saucer thrown into the air and photographed at the peak of its flight.

During the week a number of eyewitness' reports from people who said they saw strange objects in the sky were received by The News and The Mail. They will be forwarded to the recently formed Flying Saucer Investigation Committee, which will hold its first meeting soon.
