

## **FLYING SAUCER SIGHTED**

Two residents of New Lambton have reported seeing a flying saucer over Newcastle.

They both saw a luminous saucer-like object in the sky about the same time.

They told Mr. Mark Howarth of Grange Mount Observatory what they had seen.

He sent the information on to civil aviation authorities, who had asked for reports on flying saucers.

One woman said she was sitting in the garden of her home near Orchardtown Road at 7.45 p.m. when she saw a luminous object in the sky travelling west.

### **"Blue Colour"**

It was a soft blue colour and not completely circular in shape, being slightly lopsided.

She said the object was flying at an angle of 30 degrees to 40 degrees from where she first saw it.

It was travelling at an even speed like a jet plane, but not

speed like a jet plane, but not as fast as a shooting star.

She watched it for a few seconds before it disappeared over the hills.

Mr. Howarth said flying saucers still required explanation. He would be glad of information from anyone else who saw similar objects in the sky.
