

ANOTHER FLYING SAUCER

Report Received From Cunderdin

SHINING DISK SEEN BY THREE PEOPLE

Cunderdin, Feb. 4.—A report of a big shiny flat disk, first floating stationary in the sky and then moving westwards, has been made to the Cunderdin police.

Two women and a man saw it about 5-45 p.m. yesterday as they walked over the paddocks of a farm, five miles south of Cunderdin.

They were Mrs. R. D. Brechin, whose husband owns the farm, her sister, Miss June Devenish and a farmhand, Mr. J. Pagan.

Although not at a great height it appeared to be about the size of a big aircraft as it glittered in the sun overhead.

For about five minutes it remained stationary and then it moved slowly westwards taking about 15 minutes to disappear over the horizon.

All three agreed that the object made no sound as it

object made no sound as it was suspended over their heads or as it moved westwards.

When they reported to the Cunderdin police immediately after the object disappeared, all three pointed out that they did not drink or smoke, and that it could not have been a vision.

What puzzled them most was that it remained stationary overhead for about five minutes.

The two women saw it first as they were walking over paddocks with Mr. Pagan to attend to sheep.
