

# **FLYING OBJECT SEEN OVER R'TON**

A report of a round object, with bright tail, seen flying over Rockhampton about 11.45 p.m. Saturday by Mrs J. Dallon, strangely coincides with reports from Roma.

Mrs Dallon, her husband and mother were in Dawson Road when they saw the object flying parallel with the earth over the Athelstane Range.

The Roma observation, at 11.45 p.m. on Saturday, was described as a strange V-shaped object, or flying saucer, trailing flame.

A second report of a mysterious object, flying at great speed was received yesterday afternoon.

Mr R. Curry, an ambulance officer, said that about 11.53 p.m. last Saturday, while driving up the Canning Street hill to the General Hospital, he noticed a halo of light, shooting across the skyline in a south-westerly direction and trailing a long orange jet of what seemed to be vapourous gas.

### **WHIRLWIND NOISE**

**MARYBOROUGH, May 19.—**

Mr Jack Chapman, a farmer residing on the Teddington Road, six miles from Maryborough, reported having seen an object at a tremendous height about 11 a.m. on Tuesday.

Mr Chapman said his attention was attracted by a noise resembling a whirlwind in a treetop. He sighted the object, which was so high that it appeared a foot square. It was trailing long two lines of smoke or vapour.

Mr Chapman said he had seen planes at great heights during the war, but the object he saw on Tuesday was considerably higher. He was satisfied that it was a flying machine.

### **GLISTENING BALL**

**PERTH, May 19.—**A small silvery, glistening ball with a bright halo was reported over the Gascoyne River, 600 miles north of Perth, today.

Moving slowly north-east at a height of 1000 ft, it was seen by Mr R. Smith, who was working on a Gascoyne plantation.

He told the meteorologist officer at the Carnarvon

minutes. The object left no  
trail and no noise could be  
heard from where he was  
standing.
