

Further Reports Of "Sky Objects"

Several more people stated yesterday that they had seen "strange" objects in the sky on Saturday night. This followed the publication on Wednesday of reports of fast-moving objects being sighted in the direction of the Range.

MESSRS Jack Topping and George Adams, both of Mt Morgan, were returning home from Rockhampton on Saturday night, just before midnight. Suddenly the sky lit up and they stopped the car to watch what they thought was a meteor.

The object moved from the Yaamba direction towards the ranges, then veered off into space.

The two men described it as being black in front with yellow and red flames coming from the rear for about 20 ft. It was travelling at a height of approximately 5000 ft at a very fast rate of speed. They watched it for 15 sec-

Two other Rockhampton

citizens reported seeing a bright object moving fast through the sky in the region of the Athelstane Range shortly before midnight on Saturday.

MARYBOROUGH REPORT

MARYBOROUGH, May 20—
A Bauple resident, Mr Sheldon Stringer, who heard a mysterious noise on Tuesday morning but could not trace its origin, today at 1.35 p.m. heard a similar sound and saw an object at a great height in the sky travelling at terrific speed in a southerly direction.

Mr Stringer, who saw the object through field glasses for about 30 seconds, said the object was shaped like a plane. Its body was dark, but its tail was a light colour.

He estimated its height at about six to seven miles, because it was passing through cirrus clouds which are found at that height. The course taken by the object was very erratic.

The object which Mr Jack Chapman, of Teddington

Chapman, of Teddington Road, Tinana, about six miles from Maryborough, saw on Tuesday morning between 10 and 11 o'clock, was seen by Mrs L. Hoult and three members of her family at Antigua, about 12 miles from Maryborough, and its sound, like that of a blow lamp or whirlwind, was heard by Mr Ray Sullivan, at The Diamonds, a fishing spot in the Mary River, about 10 miles from Maryborough, and by two workmen at Mungar, 16 miles from Maryborough.

AT BUNDABERG

BUNDABERG, May 20—People in Bundaberg and district today reported seeing or hearing a strange object which, they believe may have been a "flying saucer."

At approximately 1.45 p.m., one Bundaberg woman and several Gin Gin residents claimed they heard a peculiar noise overhead, which attracted their attention.

A South Bundaberg woman said her attention was attracted by a strange rumbling noise while she was in her backyard. The noise was quite different from that of the engines of an aeroplane.
