

# Drew blank with "saucer" photo

**G**RAHAME Ball, 18, of Milton Road, Toowong, last night fired the latest shot in the "flying saucer" controversy.

At 5.30 pm yesterday, he claimed he saw a "saucer" from his home and tried to photograph it.

Until then he was an "unbeliever" and scorned the stories of "flying saucers."

## Knows planes

Grahame claimed he saw the "saucer" for about three or four minutes. It went slowly at first, then flashed towards the south and disappeared.

"It was like an electric light bulb high in the sky," he said.

He said his mother also saw it. He had spent three years in the Air Training Corps and knew all types of aircraft.

Civil Aviation authorities said there were no aircraft flying in the area at 5.30.

The Courier-Mail photographers developed Grahame's film of the shot he had tried to take of the "saucer." — It was blank.

about half a minute at approximately 5.25 pm. It was brightly lit up, circular and was travelling in a southerly direction at about 14,000 feet.
