

Still the saucers go flying

Last night's flying saucer bulletin —

SYDNEY (2): A cigar-shaped object manned by "supermen" wearing transparent clothing. A blue, then green, then red, then blue object "brighter than the stars."

MELBOURNE (2): One moving slowly and spitting sparks. One, "a red dot with a halo," appearing in the same piece of sky for the second successive night.

The score on saucer-sighting was even between Melbourne and Sydney last night.

Mr. William Mitchell, 34, of Little Bay, Sydney, said two people who appeared to be super-beings manned a cigar-shaped silver colored object about 60ft. long flying 600ft. over Botany Bay at 6 a.m. today.

"There were two big men, exceptionally big men, at the controls. They didn't appear to be ordinary people.

"It terrified me. I have been through the war, but have never seen anything like this.

He said the object travelled at terrific speed and was brilliantly lit with green and yellow lights.

Balmain, Sydney, also claimed to have seen "an unusual object" in the sky about 7.15 p.m.

"At first it was blue and then it changed to green, then to red, and then back to blue again.

"It was bright orange, and seemed to be emitting sparks." Mr. M. Ohlmus, Social Services Department clerk, said last night, reporting a saucer he had seen from Canterbury rd., St. Kilda.

Mr. Kevin Phillips, of Gotha st., West Heidelberg, reported a "strange object in the sky" which has appeared at the same time for two consecutive nights.
