

FLYING SAUCERS OVER SYDNEY?

SYDNEY, Tues.—Sydney is getting a rush of flying saucer reports. Last night and early today scores of people living in different suburbs reported seeing "things" in the sky.

The Weather Bureau and Sydney and Riverview observatories said that they were not "natural phenomena."

The Weather Bureau Meteorologist (Mr. K. McKinnon) saw what he described as "a light

about 2,000ft. up, that hovered for several minutes."

Mr. J. Fawcett, manager of a flying school at Illawarra, on the N.S.W. south coast, reported seeing a light "about 3,000 ft. up, bigger and brighter than any star."

"Maybe it was a flying saucer, but I'd like another look at it before I gave an opinion," he said.

Others said that the light frequently changed colour.

Later, people said that they saw a long, blue object, shooting blue flame, flying over Sydney this morning.

Mr. W. Mitchell, of Little Bay, said that it looked like a railway carriage, and was about 600ft. up.

Miss Amy Phillips, of Maroubra, described it as 30ft. long and 10ft. wide.

Airport authorities said that no planes were in the areas when the objects were seen.

All viewers said definitely that the objects were not planes.
