

Flying Saucer Looped The Loop

MURWILLUMBAH June 20.

—A flying saucer watched by six Tweed residents tonight looped the loop before it disappeared.

The six spectators, residents of Crystal Creek, watched the saucer for 15 minutes as it "streaked in various directions, returning each time to hover over the same place before finally disappearing."

One of the people, Mr Ray Carnow, described the mystery as a "monster compared with the biggest star in the sky."

He said he was with five other persons at Crystal Creek when the saucer was first sighted south-west from them at 8.15 p.m. It was then hovering over a nearby hill.

During the next 15 minutes the saucer moved off to the east, returned and went to the west, returned again and hovered and then "went in various directions, each time returning and hovering over the same area."

He said the object finally "looped the loop, then lost in-

"looped the loop, then lost intensity and disappeared."

Mr Curnow said that he and the rest of the group watched the object continuously for 15 minutes before it disappeared.

He said it appeared low over the crest of the surrounding hills and appeared to be about five times larger in diameter than the biggest star in the sky and about four or five miles away.

Mr Curnow said the object was "like a bright light or bright star, which changed colour and glittered like a cut diamond."
