

"Flying Saucer" Was Balloon

LONDON: British meteorological experts who studied a "flying saucer" for over an hour on Wednesday explained it was a 60ft. balloon released by scientists at Cardington, Bedfordshire for cosmic radiation research.

A timing apparatus would

drop the scientific equipment by parachute.

Asked what happened to the balloon Professor Powell, of Bristol, explained blandly, "It drifts on and becomes 'flying saucers'."
